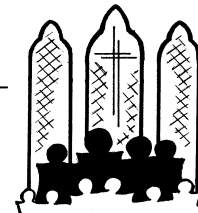

I'm writing this on the flight to Napier, having managed once again to have spent as little time as possible at the airport (25 minutes).


On my way to Forum, it is easy to reflect on what it is that makes Forum a great event to attend each year - the differences and the similarities. Often the young people attend realise that they are part of a much wider church (it is interesting to note that almost all the clergy under the age of thirty were involved in national or diocesan ministry at some point before ordination). Others find it a chance to discover new theology, a wider perspective, and learn to live alongside our Anglican siblings even within our differences.

Often too there are calls for wider networking, a church that Trades more fairly, and closer relationships with our tikanga partners. But for me what brings me back each year is the chance to network, and now pass on the knowledge and ethos that I was imparted when I started going. Each year brings something different and new faces. It is a brilliant learning and educational experience whether it is your first time attending, or ninth. The Eucharistic meal involving The Great Sandwich Thanksgiving was a highlight of Dunedin in 2007, shadowed only by Rebecca and I becoming a part of it at its conclusion.

National Youth Forum: tikanga pakeha is the national gathering of young people from around the country. They gather in a different location each year to discuss, learn, network, fellowship and worship. With all good Anglican gatherings there is also business to attend to, with elections onto oversight committees and decision making bodies. This year's topic is entitled Jesus M.C. (Missional Community) and will be looking deeply into the role of the Five Marks of Mission in who we are and what we do.

Milly Dixon has attended this year also on behalf of the parish and the diocese. She will report to you in much more detail in the next Logos.
